Ralph Adams Cram (1863-1942) Architect/builder of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church (1909)

Renowned architect of Gothic Revival design, Mr. Cram was commissioned to build the St. Andrew's church in Denver. Its geography is unique. Mr. Cram's other structures are east of the Mississippi River – primarily on the East Coast.

During roughly the same time period that he designed/built the St. Andrew's parish, he also designed/built his own private chapel. It was named St. Elizabeth's Chapel and located on 114 acres of his private "seasonal and spiritual retreat" in Sudbury, Massachusetts. In 1964, the current St. Elizabeth's Episcopal Church was built on the property. Accompanying pictures show Mr. Cram at the door of his private chapel ca. 1920's and the chapel interior.
